- Signposting to the local practice nurse, GP, or other community organisations where appropriate
- Raise awareness of Macmillan services by distributing information at the Library
- Organising refreshments for the group

- Good listening and relationship-building skills
- Friendly and empathetic
- Well-organised and committed
- Discreet and trustworthy
